Message from the Executive Director

Thanks to your generosity, last year United Way of Beaver County (UWBC) distributed \$460,500 to our 17 Member Agencies—organizations working tirelessly to support those in need. Because of UWBC funding, 141,705 individuals received help when they needed it most.

In addition, because of your contributions to The ALICE Fund, we have awarded \$120,000 to non-member agencies that directly support ALICE families—those who are **working hard, but still struggling to make ends meet**. Through these mini-grants, we helped an additional 12,621 children and adults with food, after-school programs, rent, utilities, and more. Think about that: for less than \$10 per person, we offered hope—perhaps just enough to keep someone from slipping through the cracks.

But the cracks are widening.

According to 2023 Census data, **29% of Beaver County households are ALICE**. Another 11% live in poverty. That's **4 out of every 10 families**, our neighbors, who are unable to afford the essentials.

I've heard stories that are hard to forget—parents working two, even three jobs, doing everything right, yet still lining up at food banks to feed their children. The survival budget for a Beaver County family of four is \$85,356. This is a staggering increase from \$69,936 just two years ago. Few households receive raises of more than \$15,000 over two years' time. This means that people are slipping further and further behind while still working just as hard. These are real people. People you may pass in the grocery store, sit beside in church, even see across your fence. People who are exhausted, proud, and quietly falling behind.

That's why we are committed to not just providing a safety net. We want to build **a ladder**.

Tonight, you'll hear about **United Works**, our new partnership with Job Training for Beaver County. This program is about more than jobs. It's about dignity, opportunity, and possibility. It offers ALICE families a chance to move forward, not just stay afloat. And it has the power to uplift not only individuals, but our entire community—from local colleges like CCBC and Penn State Beaver to the unions offering apprenticeships and training.

This is our path forward. Let's make it transformative and meaningful.

I'm incredibly grateful for everything you've done. But I'm also asking you to stay with us. **To keep giving. To spread the word.** Someone you know, maybe someone you don't realize is struggling, might find their missing link in **United Works**. It's not a fit for everyone. But for the right person, it could be life-changing.

Our 2025-2026 campaign theme is once again: **Stronger Together: United, Communities Thrive**. I encourage you to read it both ways, with and without the comma. Either way, the message is clear and more important than ever.

Thank you for your unwavering support and dedication. Let's make this A Night to Unite!

Crop & Kettle, an ALICE Mini-Grant Recipient

Matthew, a one-time high school dropout, came to Crop & Kettle as part of an intentional, multi-step process to get his life back on track and support his family of four. Earlier in the year he earned his GED and accepted a job with Parkhurst Dining to pursue his passion of cooking. Knowing he wanted to formalize his skills and accelerate his career, he enrolled at Crop & Kettle. Completing the program, Matt earned four certifications. Following graduation, he was immediately promoted to a management role at his company. The role offers Matt increased pay, health care benefits and more consistent hours.

Member Agency/Emergency Food Box Program

We received a call from a couple who were living in a tent and had previously relied on a local convenience store to heat their food. However, they were no longer permitted to use the store's microwave and had no access to food or means of preparation. In response, we were able to act promptly, delivering a food box containing ready-to-eat items and beverages that required no cooking, a list of community resources, and explained about our transportation program that could help them connect to community resources.

Mini-Grant Awardees

In November 2024, United Way of Beaver County awarded \$50,000 in mini-grants from The ALICE Fund to four Beaver County non-profit organizations that provide utility bill payment assistance. These ALICE mini-grants served the ALICE (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed) households in Beaver County specifically, as ALICE families often do not qualify for other utility assistance programs. We are proud to have helped 182 households with their utility bills, in some cases allowing them to remain in their homes and remain together as a family.

This round of mini-grants focused on utility assistance in response to the escalating number of requests reported by PA211, as well as calls received at the United Way of Beaver County office.

A marine veteran was enrolled in the Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) program and received assistance with getting an apartment for himself and his children. Per his lease, he was to get the electric in his name within 30 days. The individual had an outstanding balance with the utility company and could not afford to pay the arrearages, leading him to be at risk of eviction due to a lease violation. The ALICE grant was able to assist this individual with his back balance and his utility deposit in order to stabilize himself and his children in their forever home.

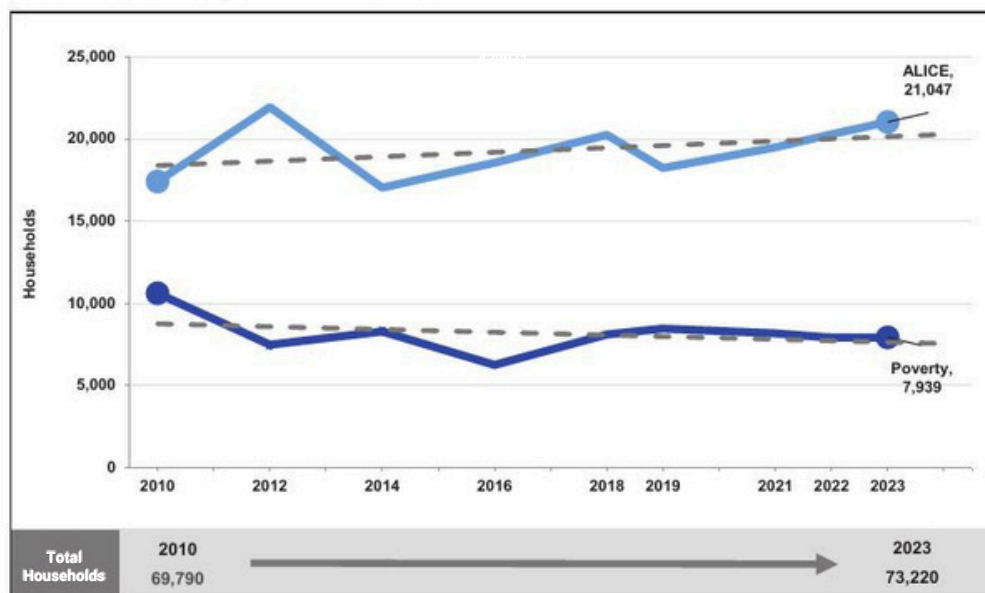

Trends in Financial Hardship

ALICE is an acronym for **A**sset **L**imited, **I**ncome **C**onstrained, **E**mployed – households that earn more than the Federal Poverty Level, but less than the basic cost of living for the county (the ALICE Threshold). Households below the ALICE Threshold – ALICE households plus those in poverty – can't afford the essentials.

Households move below or above the ALICE Threshold as economic factors and circumstances change. The line graph to the right shows the number of ALICE and poverty-level households (solid blue lines), as well as the trend over time (dotted gray lines). **By 2023, 28,986 households (40%) were below the ALICE Threshold in Beaver County.**

The Cost of Basics Outpaces Wages

The Household Survival Budget reflects the minimum cost to live and work in the current economy and includes housing, child care, food, transportation, health care, technology, and taxes. It does not include savings for emergencies or future goals like college or retirement. The Household Survival Budget is calculated at the county level and by household composition, as costs can vary greatly depending on location and household needs.

In 2023, household costs in Beaver County were well above the Federal Poverty Level of \$14,580 for a single adult and \$30,000 for a family of four.

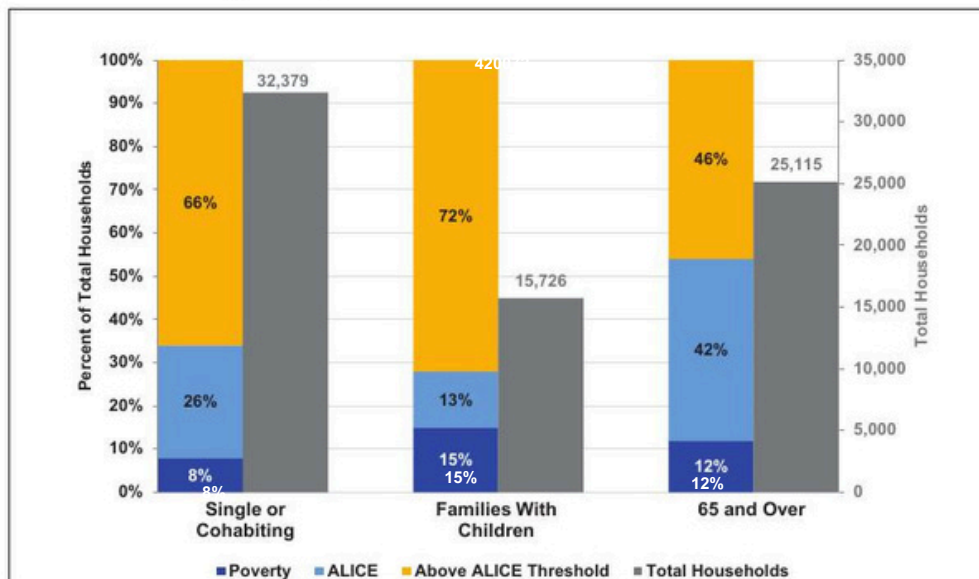

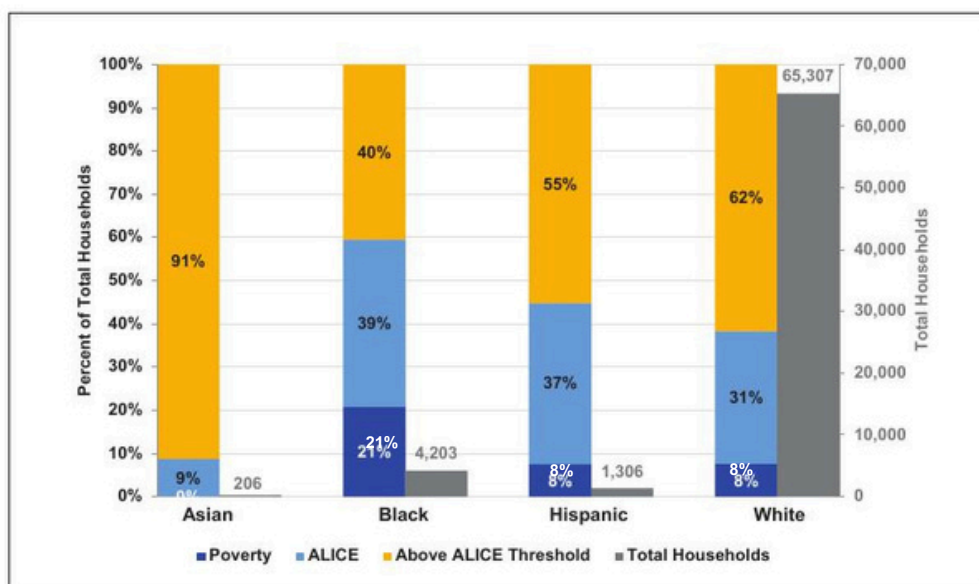
Household Financial Status by Household Type, Beaver County, 2023

United Works

A collaborative program between Job Training for Beaver County & United Way of Beaver County.



United Way of Beaver County (UWBC), in collaboration with Job Training for Beaver County, Inc. (JTBC), has launched **United Works**, a workforce development program for Beaver County residents who are working, sometimes multiple jobs, and still can't make ends meet. United Works can help people access valuable educational opportunities that were previously out of reach due to cost. The goal is to provide financial assistance for training needed to secure well-paying, meaningful jobs, and ultimately, transition to a higher level of financial stability.

United Works funds will specifically support tuition and supportive services for students who earn a little too much to qualify for other grants. This can allow more individuals to access the education and resources they need to thrive.

Job Training for Beaver County will work with the applicant to determine eligibility.



To be eligible, a person must:

- Be 18 years of age or older
- Have a high school diploma or GED
- Reside in Beaver County
- Provide verification that current household income is under ALICE household survival budget guidelines - <https://unitedforalice.org/household-budgets/pennsylvania>
- Be accepted into an eligible CCBC training program, an eligible Penn State Beaver training program, or a building and construction trades pre-apprenticeship or registered apprenticeship program

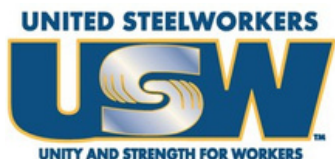
